## **SUMMARY**

- ➤ Polo (Sagol Kangjei) originated in Manipur during the reign of 'King Kangba' in Manipur.
- 'Cheitharol Kumbaba' has many interesting accounts of the game.
- Polo is in the Guinness book of Records (1992).
- It was a very handy tool for making friendship.
- The earliest club was *Cachar Club* founded in **1859** in *Assam*.
- The oldest club still in existence is the *Calcutta Polo Club* (1862).
- The game was taken to *England* from *India* in 1869 by 10<sup>th</sup> *Hussars* at *Aldershot*.
- In olden days, there were no goal posts and number of players was variable and there was hardly any rule.
- During the reign of 'King Khagemba', the number was standardized to seven (7).
- ➤ It starts with the throwing up of the ball (*Kangdrum*) in the air with the cry "*Hantre*" by an official known as '*Hantre Hunba*'.
- The horse or *pony* became a weapon of war and an instrument for the expansion of the kingdom.
