- His discovery of the anti-rabi vaccine was also one of his great gifts to mankind.
- The process of 'pasteurization' he discovered was a great contribution to food technologists and housewives.
- He was known as 'the white knight of science' for his passionate concern for the welfare of mankind.
- The Pasteur Institute in Paris was established in 1888 as a mark of respect and gratitude to him. It is a great centre for the study of microbes and germs.
