

## CLASS IX ENGLISH COURSE BOOK UNIT I - THE LAND LESSON B - THE ENCHANTING SHIRUI LILY

## **NOTES**

- Shirui lily (*Lilium mackliniae*) is Manipuri's unique gift to the floral wealth of the world because it refuses to grow and flourish anywhere except in its native habitat the Shirui hills.
- Shirui lily was discovered by Frank Kingdom Ward, a botanist from United Kingdom in 1946.
- ➤ Shirui lily grows only in its native habitat on the top of Shirui hills in Ukhrul district i.e. cannot be grown outside the climate and ecosystem of Shirui hills.
- Shirui lily grows for about six weeks each year i.e. the first week of May to the mid of June.
- ➤ The temperate forest at the attitude of about 8,500 feet (2,835 metres) above mean sea level of the Shirui hills, provides the ideal ecosystem for the lily.
- > Special expeditions are organized to visit Shirui hills.
- > Several measures taken to preserve this rare flower.
- Out of ignorance, curiosity and mindlessness, the visitors plucked the lilies and uprooted its plants which resulted in the reduction of the number of lily.
- > Everyone must protect and preserve the Shirui lily.
- > The responsibility for protection and preservation of Shirui lily lies with the people of Manipur.
